



Monday Night Pistol League - Silhouette Shoot

The Monday Night Recreational Shoot has finished their Monday night pistol shoots and is shooting steel silhouettes on Mondays at 7:30 pm on the indoor range. The silhouette shoot continues through May 21.

The cost for the silhouette shoot is \$2 per line with the winner of the line getting his money back. The course is 10 shots at 3 separate metal targets (chickens, groundhogs, and pigs) for a total of 30 shots per line.

You will need your favorite .22 calibre firearm, 30 rounds of ammunition per line (with a velocity under 1200 fps), and eye and ear protection. Each 5-shot round of shooting is timed at 1 minute.

Basic Pistol Course

The Club conducted an NRA Basic Pistol Course on Saturday, March 24. Because of the popularity of this course, another class has been planned for June 23 from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. The course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude for safely owning and operating a handgun.

The course is a minimum of 8 hours and includes classroom and range time learning to shoot revolvers and/or semi-automatic pistols. Students learn the NRA's rules for safe gun handling; pistol parts and operation; ammunition; shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting from the bench rest position and two-handed standing positions; cleaning the pistol. They will receive the NRA Guide to the Basics of Pistol Shooting handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, take a Basics of Pistol Shooting Student Examination, and receive a course completion certificate.

The course fee is \$60 for Club members and \$75 for non-members. A \$25 non-refundable deposit is required to register. Everyone is urged to bring a lunch and nonalcoholic beverage. If you bring your own firearm, the following ammunition restrictions apply: velocity must be less than 1200 fps, no +P, +P+, Magnum, or .17 or 5.7x28 cartridges permitted.

If you do not have your own firearm the Club will provide .22 calibre firearms and ammunition for you to use along with eye and ear protection.
