## New Entry System to be Installed

The Club is installing a new entry system to access the Club grounds and the Club House. The new access system should be installed and operating by August 11, 2013. Once the new access system is operational you will need a "FOB" to gain access to the property and your old membership card will not work any longer. The new FOB is a small device (1/2" x 1-1/2") which does not have to be swiped like a credit card; it merely has to be in close proximity (within about 2 inches) to the new readers to activate the access system.

For security and liability reasons, members MUST PERSONALLY PICK UP THEIR NEW FOB (the only exception are Associate members - their FOBs may be picked by their spouses). Between now and the planned switch-over date there will be 2 membership meetings, 2 directors meetings, and we have set up several afternoons and evenings for members to come to the Club and pick up their new access FOB. After August 11, members will have to pick up their new access FOB at a membership or director's meeting (1st or 3rd Tuesday of the month).

When you come to pick up your new access FOB, you will need your 2013 membership card, range card, and drivers license. You will have to sign for the FOB and complete a form with some membership information on it. We will be updating our membership records with this new information.

You will be able to pick up your new FOBs on the following dates and times:

- Tuesday, August 6 6 to 10 pm;
- Tuesday, July 2 6 to 10 pm;
- Tuesday, July 16 6 to 9 pm;
- Sunday, August 11 Noon to 4 pm; Wednesday, July 10 6 to 9 pm:
- Tuesday, July 23 6 to 9 pm;
- Sunday, July 14 Noon to 4 pm;

### **Monday Night Pistol League**

The Monday Night Recreational Shoot will resume their recreational shooting on September 9 at 7:30 pm on the indoor 50-ft range.

The cost for the 20-week season is \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. People that can't commit to the entire 20-week period can pay as they go - at \$3 per night for members and \$4 per night for non-members.

You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition - .22 or center fire with a velocity under 1200 fps, and eye and ear protection. There is a timed fire segment (5 shots in 20 seconds) and a rapid fire segment (5 shots in 10 seconds) so a semi-automatic pistol is recommended; however, those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the lines. ### **Bowling Pin Shoot**

The Monday Bowling Pin Shoot is underway on the outdoor range. They shoot at 6 pm every Monday evening using suspended bowling pins. You need a center fire pistol with iron sights to compete for the prize money. The cost is \$2 per line and the winner of each line gets 1/2 the money. You can use a pistol with a red dot but you are not eligible to win the money. The course of fire is 25 rounds.

#### **CMP**

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Hi-Power Shoot is held on the 2nd Sunday of the month at 10 am on the outdoor 100-yard range. They shoot M-1 rifles which are provided by the Club. The cost per session is only \$25 and that includes 64 rounds for 3 targets.

This is a fun activity and should be better attended. If you are interested in shooting the WWII M-1 come out and give it a try.

#### **Metro Police Revolver** League

The Metropolitan Police Revolver League shoots on Thursday evenings on the outdoor range. Their outdoor season continues through August. They are currently in 4th place in .22 competition and 4th place in center-fire.

The team is always looking for good pistol shooters: .22 and or center fire. The team invites anyone who is interested to come out to one of their Thursday night shoots and give it a try. Their competition can be described as trying to shoot the bottom of a spray painted one-pound coffee can 50 yards downrange with your favorite pistol in one hand, standing up with no rest.

Bull's-eye goes back to the 1941 and is the granddaddy of all popular handgun competition in this country. Its has been the standard for national and state championships, regional championships, and most outdoor tournaments.

If this sounds interesting and challenging, come out and give it a try. The team shoots on Thursday evenings at 6:00 p.m.

All you need is a .22 caliber or center fire pistol that can hold at least 5 rounds with a barrel length that is practical for target shooting; the gun should have adjustable sights if you are going to use iron sights but red dot sights (not lasers) are also permitted; at least 30 rounds of ammunition for each gun; and eye and ear protection (mandatory). A spotting scope is also very helpful; however, it is not really needed to participate.

You can shoot .22 and/or center fire.

The team usually starts with the .22 match. The first target is a slow fire target and you have 10 minutes to shoot 10 rounds. The second target is a timed fire target and you shoot two five-shot strings, each string to be fired in a time of 20 seconds. The third target is a rapid fire target and you shoot two five-shot strings, each string fired in a time of 10 seconds. After the .22 match they do it all over again but with a center fire pistol.

Both revolvers and semi-autos are permitted, however, a semi-auto is easier for the timed and rapid fire stages.

For indoor competition, all targets are posted at 50 feet; for outdoor competition the slow fire target is posted at 50 yards and the timed and rapid fire targets at 25 yards.

They will be more than glad to introduce you to the sport and tell you all about it. You are welcome to join the team in the live firing of each stage so you can get a feel for what they do. If you have any questions, call Deny Nill at 412-531-5890 or Bill Kramer at 412-835-5453.
