### Monday Night Recreational Pistol League

The Monday Night Pistol League resumes its shooting on Monday, September 8 at 7:30 pm on the indoor range. The League is loosely organized into teams which compete against each other over the season for bragging rights. They take a break at the Christmas - New Year holidays and enjoy a banquet at the end of the season, then switch over to a silhouette shoot after their season ends.

The cost for the 20-week season is \$30 (members) and \$40 (non-members). People that can't commit to the entire 20-week period can pay as they go - at \$3 per night (members) and \$4 per night (non-members).

You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition - .22 or center fire with a velocity under 1200 fps, and eye and ear protection. There is a timed fire segment (5 shots in 20 seconds) and a rapid fire segment (5 shots in 10 seconds) - a semi-automatic pistol is recommended. Those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the lines. ### CMP

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Hi-Power Shoot is held on the 2nd Sunday of the month at 10:00 am on the outdoor 100-yard range. They shoot M-1 rifles which are provided by the Club. The cost per session is only \$25 and that includes use of the M-1, 64 rounds of ammunition (4 sighter rounds plus 60 rounds to complete the course - 20 prone, 20 sitting, and 20 offhand), and targets. (You can't even buy ammunition this cheap.) Shooters need to provide their own eye and ear protection.

This is a fun activity and should be better attended. If you are interested in shooting the WWII M-1 come out and give it a try.

### Metro Police Revolver League

The Metropolitan Police Revolver League shoots on Thursday evenings at 6:00 p.m.

Their outdoor season finished at the end of August and as of Match 11, they were third in .22 competition and fourth in center-fire. They are shooting outdoors now practicing for their winter season. They will move to the indoor range on Thursday evenings when weather and light conditions preclude use of the outdoor range.

They are always looking for good pistol shooters: .22 and or center-fire and the team invites anyone who is interested to come out to one of their Thursday night shoots and give it a try. All you need is a .22 caliber or center-fire pistol that can hold at least 5 rounds with a barrel length that is practical for target shooting; the gun should have adjustable sights if you are going to use iron sights but red dot sights (not lasers) are also permitted; at least 30 rounds of ammunition for each gun; and eye and ear protection (mandatory). A spotting scope is also very helpful; however, it is not really necessary to participate.

You can shoot .22 and/or center fire competition.

The team usually starts with the .22 match. The first line of fire is 10 minutes to shoot 10 rounds; the second line of fire consists of two five-shot strings, each string fired in 20 seconds; the third line of fire is two five-shot strings, each string fired in 10 seconds. After the .22 match they do it all over again with a center fire pistol.

Both revolvers and semi-autos are permitted, however, a semi-auto is easier for the timed and rapid fire strings of fire.

For indoor competition, all targets are posted at 50 feet; for outdoor competition the slow fire target is posted at 50 yards and the timed and rapid fire targets at 25 yards.
