Board of Directors Election in January

Five positions on the Board of Directors are up for election in January. The Board is made up of 15 Directors who each serve a three-year term with one-third of the Board (five Directors) being elected every January. The five Directors who are up for election in January have agreed to run for another 3-year term and will be on the ballot. Nominations for the position of Director will also be taken from the floor; however, the nominee must be present and must agree, if elected, to accept the position. The only criteria for holding office is that the individual must have been a member of the club for at least 1 year. The five Directors who are up for

re-election are: Stan Geirlack, Ron Milanek, Joe Montuoro, Denny Nill, and Mike Perry. To vote in the election, an individual must be a member of the club for at least 2 months.

Lottery Calendar Fund Raiser The Lottery Calendars, which are good from January through April, are ready for members to pick-up and sell.

They are packed in 5 or 10 calendars per envelope. The cost of each calendar is \$10; each calendar contains a 3-digit number. The winning number is determined by the 3-digit evening PA Lottery number. They start on January 1st and go to the end of April. They can be picked up at the club anytime there is an organized shoot, such as trap shooting on Sundays from 1 to 4 pm and on Wednesdays from 7 to 9 pm (weather permitting); the Monday night pistol shoot from 7:30 to 9 pm; Junior Rifle on Wednesday evenings from 7 to 9 pm; and at our meetings, both membership and directors, from 8 to 10 pm. They make great stocking stuffers and are good for those last minute Christmas gifts. To be valid, all tickets must be either turned in at the Club or proof of sale by e-mail (see below) or phone call (to the Club message line at 724-348-7941) by the 31st of December. If you have sold some and can't get them into the Club before the deadline, you can call and leave your name and a brief message that envelope number "X" was sold or that tickets "a, b, and c" were sold. Notice - The baffles on the indoor range continue to be shot and deformed. The Director's are looking into a solution to what could become an extremely dangerous condition. The Baffles will need to be repaired this is not an inexpensive process. Shooters need to follow the range requirements for the ammunition they are using. Members found to violate these rules will be removed from the club. Also be sure you know where your bullets are going if you are using the 27-foot line.

The Upper St. Clair High School (USC) rifle team will once again be using our indoor range for practice and meets. As you may recall they lost the use of the range at their high school and this is the third year we will be hosting them at the Club.

After the last two shooting seasons, there were no complaints from the membership on their using the range which is closed to the membership while they are here. Similar to last year they will be using the range between 3:00 pm and 6:00 pm one or two days a week with the rare occasion of three days a week when they host a scheduled meet.

We will post the schedule by the sign-in book for the indoor range as soon as it's finalized. If any of our members have to adjust their shooting schedule we trust you will understand. We hope you can adjust your range usage to the days they are not shooting.

Recreational Pistol League

The Recreational Pistol League started their season on Monday, September 12 at 7:30 p.m. on the indoor range. The League is loosely organized into teams which compete against each other over the season for bragging rights. Their season starts in September and ends some time in May. Shooting for 20 weeks, they take a break at the Christmas - New Year holidays and enjoy a "banquet" at the end of the season. When their season ends they switch over to shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range for a few weeks before moving to the outdoor range for the Club's Summer Bowling Pin Shoot.

The course of fire includes 5 segments - all on regulation NRA targets. The first segment is two lines of slow fire (5 shots in 2 minutes); the second segment is two lines of timed-fire (5 shots in 20 seconds); the next phase is two lines of rapid fire (5 shots in 10 seconds). Segment 4 is two lines of timed-fire (5 shots, change magazine, 5 more shots in 45 seconds; segment 5 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots - one-handed - in 60 seconds.

Because of the time constraints, a semi-automatic pistol is recommended. You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition (remember on the indoor range ammunition must have a muzzle velocity of under 1200 feet per second), and eye and ear protection. Those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the course of fire. 22 caliber pistols are recommended because of the cost on ammunition now.

The cost for the 20-week season is \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. Shooters that can't commit to the entire 20-week season can pay on a per-night basis - at \$3 per night for members and \$4 per night for non-members. • Tactical Shoots

There is one tactical shoot scheduled for the remainder of the year - Tuesday, November 22 (from 7:00 p.m. to 10:30 p.m.). To be eligible to participate in this tactical shoot, you must have successfully completed the PPIH and/or PPOH Course conducted at the Club or an NRA PPIH / PPOH Course at another club. You will be required to provide the original Course Completion Certificates.

Please note that if you have not been shooting on a regular basis and have not maintained your safety, gun handling, and marksmanship skills you will need to brush up on your shooting before you can participate in the tactical shoots.

Junior Rifle Program

The Junior Rifle Program for shooters age 12 to 80 (or older) began on Wednesday, October 5 at 7:00 pm. They shoot till 9:00 pm because this is a school night for the juniors. There are two parts to the program - an introductory course where participants learn rifle safety and shooting techniques including handling, maintenance, aiming, and shooting. This is a 4-week course and will go from October 5 through October 26. The cost for this portion of the program was \$40 per shooter and includes use of the rifle, all ammunition, and the loan of eye and ear protection.

The second part of the program is the practice session. Starting in November, at the end of the introductory course, shooters can continue to improve their shooting skills in these practice sessions which are held every Wednesday at 7:00 pm through the end of March. The cost for the practice session was \$45 and again includes the rifle, all ammunition, and the loan of eye and ear protection. The juniors are encouraged to bring their homework for times when they will be waiting to get on the range.

Open Trap Shooting

The Club holds open trap shooting on Wednesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and on Sundays from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. These shooting sessions are open to the public. The cost for a 25-bird line of trap is now \$3.00. Shooters can bring their own shotgun shells (shot no larger than 7 1/2) or they can buy shotgun shells at \$8.00 a box at the range.
