Learn Basic Handgun Fundamentals with **Mike Thatcher and US Marines Reservists**

On Saturday, April 1, 2017, the Carrick Sportsmen's Club will host a Basic Handgun Course to develop more responsible and proficient owners of firearms, to introduce Mike Thatcher (Major, USMC Reserve) as a candidate for Magisterial District Judge, and to promote Carrick Sportsmen's Club as a positive environment to enjoy the shooting sports. This event will give participants the foundations of handgun safety, handling, and marksmanship. It will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Mike and his friends (USMC Reservists) will conduct non-live fire and live fire training with students. This course will include classroom instruction, practical application, one-on-one live-fire training, and refreshments. At the end of the course the students will have a solid foundation in handgun safety, handling, and marksmanship. The cost of the course is a \$50 minimum donation per person.

Junior Rifle Program

The Junior Rifle Program for shooters age 12 to 80 (or older). began on the October 5. They shoot from 7:00 p.m. till 9:00 p.m. on Wednesdays. There are two parts to the program - an intro- $\frac{1}{-2}$ will need to be proficient in the safe handling of the firearm, gun

ductory course and a practice session. The introductory course teaches rifle safety and shooting techniques including handling, maintenance, aiming, and shooting. This is a 4-week course and shoots through the month of October The cost for this portion of the program is \$40 per shooter and includes use of the rifle, all ammunition, and the loan of eye and ear protection.

The practice session, which starts at the end of the introductory course in November, enables the shooters to improve their shooting skills. The sessions are held every Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. from November through the end of March. The junior rifle program will be ending their shooting session on March 29.

Junior Shotgun Program The Junior Shotgun program will be back in June. This pro-

gram is available to anyone who wants to learn to shoot trap, in a controlled, safe environment with experienced instructors, particularly those younger shooters who are new to the shooting sports. The program is for ages 12 and up. Again the program is centered around teaching the proper safety and techniques in shooting a shotgun,

It will be held on Wednesday evening from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. starting on June 7 and will run till June 28. The cost is \$3 per line of 25 birds and \$7 for the shotgun shells. The Club will provide the shotgun and the eye and ear protection.

Recreational Pistol League

The Monday Night Recreational Shoot will finish their Monday night pistol shoots in a week or so and will begin shooting steel silhouettes at 7:30 pm on the indoor range. The silhouette shoot will continue through April - then they will move outside for their bowling pin shoots.

The cost for the silhouettes is \$2 per line with the winner of the line getting his money back. The course is 10 shots at each of 3 separate metal targets (chickens, groundhogs, and pigs) for a total of 30 shots per line.

You will need your favorite .22 firearm, 30 rounds of ammunition per line (with a velocity under 1200 fps), and eye and ear protection. Each 10-shot round of shooting is timed at 1 minute.

There is no need to sign up for this Monday Night Silhouette Shoot; just come to the Club about 7:15 and check in. If you have any questions, please call Joe Montuoro at 412-833-0897.

NRA Classes

Basic Course - The NRA has acknowledged their newly designed Basic pistol courses are not working out as hoped. The earlier course had a much better response, attendance, and results than their new 2-phase blended course. The new blended course has not been well received by the public. The NRA is working on a new course and said it will come up with a revised offering this Spring. The Club is waiting to see the new course before offering any Basic Courses at this time.

Personal Protection Inside the Home

A Personal Protection Inside the Home (PPIH) Class is scheduled for Saturday, March 25. The prerequisite to this class is an NRA Basic Pistol Course Certificate (or recognized documented equivalent), Winchester/NRA Pistol Qualification, NRA Pistol Qualification Card, Military DD214 w/pistol qualification or passing a Pre-Course Evaluation (Pass/Fail) which permits waiver of the basic Pistol Course. PPIH is an advanced course and you handling skills (loading, unloading, reloading), and marksmanship. If you have taken a Basic Course within the past few years and have not maintained proficiency as described you will not perform as needed in the PPIH Course. Safety Before Fashion - Proper Attire for the Ranges

This should prevent a hot cartridge from being ejected and landing on the top of your foot or toe or even down the front or back of your shirt/blouse. There was recently an incident in Florida where a hot cartridge found its way into a father's shirt and onto his back. In a reactionary motion he reached to pull the shell out with his gun hand and in reaching back inadvertently shot and killed his son who was standing behind him.
