Recreational Pistol League

The Monday Night Recreational Pistol League will finish their Monday night pistol shoots in March with their annual banquet. After that, they will begin shooting steel silhouettes at 7:30 p.m. on the indoor range. The silhouette shoot will continue through April; when they will move outside for the Club's summer bowling pin

The cost to shoot the silhouettes is \$2 per line with the winner of the line getting his money back. The course of fire is 10 shots at each of 3 separate metal targets (chickens, groundhogs, and pigs) for a total of 30 shots per line. Each 10-shot round of shooting is timed at 1 minute.

You will need your favorite .22 firearm, 30 rounds of ammunition per line (with a velocity under 1200 fps), and eye and ear protection.

There is no need to sign up for this Monday Night Silhouette Shoot; just come to the Club about 7:15 p.m. and check in. If you have any questions, please call Joe Montuoro at 412-833-0897.

Metro Police Revolver League (MPRL)

Upper St. Clair Rifle Team



The Upper Saint Clair (USC) Rifle team closed their season with a record 0-8 in section competition and 0-11 overall.

Despite the numbers, the team had a very good season; they greatly improved their scoring this year and saw an improvement of 15 points per match. In competition they had several shooters hit 100 many times. In practices and matches they managed to turn in 160 perfect targets (score 100). According to Coach Tom Dietrich this has been accomplished because of more practice time and a change in the approach to coaching the team. They look forward to next year and winning many

of the matches they lost but only a few points. In fact Tom said they lost 2 matches by only 1 point and their biggest loss was only by 10.points against the section winners. The second time they shot against the winner the USC team only lost by 5 points. Their average match score this year was 791 compared to a high score of only 784 last year.

One of the highlights this season was that 5 of the team qualified to compete in the WPIAL finals. Cara Chiocca placed 10th in that competition and moved onto PIAA State competition where she finished 33rd out of over 50 competitors state-wide.
