Board of Directors Election in January

Five seats on the Board of Directors are up for election at the January membership meeting. The Board is made up of 15 Directors who each serve a three-year term with one-third of the Board (five Directors) elected every January. The five Directors up for reelection are: Ron Milanek, Joe Montuoro, Denny Nill, Jason Perry, and Mike Perry. There are seven (7) candidates running for the 5 seats on the Board of Directors - four (4) incumbents and three (3) new candidates. Nominations for the position of Director will also be taken from the floor; however, the nominee must be present and must agree to accept the position if elected. The only criteria for holding office is that the individual must have been a member of the club for at least 1 year. To vote in the election, an individual must be a member of the club for at least 2 months. The candidates for Director are:

Your membership dues for 2020 must be received by Paul Joos (Membership Chairman) on or before January 31, 2020. Any member not renewing their membership by that time will be removed from the club membership rolls; their FOB will be deactivated; and they will no longer have access to Club facilities. After a member is removed from the club membership rolls he/she must reapply for membership.

Lottery Calendars Should Have Been Turned In By Now Outstanding Lottery Calendars should have been turned in by December 31. If you still have any in your po-

Sition, please turn them in at the January membership meeting. Please note that the Lottery Calendar started on January 1. If a ticket was not identified to the Club as being "Sold" by December 31 and the number hits, there will be no payout! Tickets will be "in play" when the Club is notified that the calendar has been sold.

To avoid this problem, you can call the Club message line at 724-348-7941 and leave your name and a brief message stating that envelope number "X" was sold or that tickets "a, b, and c" were sold. The Club thanks everyone who sold or bought the Calendars. These Lottery Calendars are sold twice a year; this is the major fund-raiser for the Club and helps maintain the Club facilities and keep dues at minimal levels.

Recreational Pistol League

The Recreational Pistol League is half way through their season and will resume shooting on Monday, January 6 at 7:30 p.m. on the indoor range. The League is loosely organized into teams which compete against each other over the season for bragging rights. The second half of their 20-week season runs from January to May.

When their season ends some time in May, they switch over to shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range for a few weeks before the Club's Summer Bowling Pin Shoot starts. (This shoot might be delayed depending on the circumstances with refurbishment of the outdoor pistol range.

The recreational pistol league course of fire includes 5 segments - all on regulation NRA targets. The first segment is two lines of slow fire (each being 5 shots in 2 minutes); the second segment is two lines of timed fire (each being 5 shots in 20 seconds); the next phase is two lines of rapid fire (each being 5 shots in 10 seconds). Segment 4 is timed-fire (5 shots, change magazine, 5 more shots - all in 45 seconds); segment 5 is also timed-fire (5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots - all in 60 seconds - one-handed).

Because of the time constraints, a semi-automatic pistol is recommended. You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition (on the indoor range ammunition must have a muzzle velocity of under 1200 feet per second), and eye and ear protection. Those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the course of fire. Also, .22-caliber pistols are recommended because of the cost of ammunition.

If you have not signed up for the League, but would like to try it, just contact Steve Boehm at <u>CarrickSportsmen-</u><u>Club@gmail.com</u>. The cost is \$3 per night for members and \$4 per night for non-members or \$20 for the rest of the season for members (\$30 for non-members).

Hunter Safety Courses

The Club will once again be offering Hunter Safety courses to the public. We have one scheduled for March. The specific date will be set by the PA Game Commission. You must sign up for the course on the PA Game Commission web site. The course is now a 6-hour, 1-day class.

NRA Classes

Denny Nill is working on scheduling classes for next year and as soon as the schedule is set, we will announce it in the Newsletter and/or via e-mail. The plan is to have a few Basic Pistol courses in the early part of the year and follow-up with a Personal Protection **Inside** the Home course and a Personal Protection **Outside** the Home in the Fall.

As part of the classes he plans to revise the tactical shoots for those who have taken the Personal Protection classes.

CMP

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Hi-Power Shoot has been on permanent hiatus because of the high cost of ammunition. The cost for the 64 rounds of ammunition at current market levels will make the program too expensive for us to continue. Reminder

Any ammunition used on the indoor pistol range MUST have a muzzle velocity of less than 1200 feet/per second. The muzzle velocity should be displayed on the box/container holding the ammunition. If you can not find it ion the box, look it up. Manufacturers post the muzzle velocity of their ammunition on their web sites. Using ammunition on the indoor range with a muzzle velocity of greater than 1200 feet per second is a violation of the Club rules and will be dealt with appropriately.
