Board of Directors Election in January

(*Retired Seniors are members who are 65 years old or older, retired, on Social Security, and have been a member of the club for the previous 10 consecutive years. Members who been a member of the club for the previous 10 consecutive years and are on disability from Social Security or other Federal Agency, also qualify as a Retired Senior, regardless of age.)

Important Dates on Paying Dues

If you do not have your 2022 dues paid by Sunday, January 9, 2022, your club access FOB will be deactivated. Payment may be made at the membership or Director's meetings or you can mail it directly to:

Make your check payable to the Carrick Sportsmen's Club. If you mail it to Rob, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope to return your new membership card.

If your 2022 dues are not received by January 31, 2022, you will be removed from the club membership rolls; your FOB will be deactivated; and you will no longer have access to Club facilities. If you are removed from the club membership rolls you must reapply for membership and you will be placed on the membership waiting list. You will also relinquish your rangemaster status if you are at that level.

Range Rule Violations

It has come to the attention that members of the club have not been following the range rules. This includes loading more than 5 rounds at a time on the indoor and outdoor ranges. This is a safety issue and also is part of our federal consent agreement with South Park Township. Also, lights are being left on and doors are being left open on the ranges when the shooters leave. It is the responsibility of every club member to make sure everything is secure and cleaned up before leaving the grounds. All of the ranges and shooting positions are on camera and also on video tape. Everything you do on a range can be reviewed. If these range rule violations continue, members who are not complying will be identified and will be warned of the violations once and, if the behavior continues, will risk losing their Rangemaster status and possible termination of their membership.

Recreational Pistol League

The Recreational Pistol League will resume shooting on Monday, January 3. They were off over the holidays and will shoot the second half of their season until mid-March. When their season ends, they switch over to shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range for a few weeks before moving to the outdoor range for the Club's Summer Bowling Pin Shoot.

The course of fire for Monday nights includes 5 segments. The first segment is two lines of slow fire (each line is 5 shots in 2 minutes); the second segment is two lines of timed-fire (each line is 5 shots in 20 seconds); the next phase is two lines of rapid fire (each line is 5 shots in 10 seconds). Segment 4 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots in 45 seconds; and segment 5 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots - in 60 seconds - one-handed.

Because of the time constraints, a semi-automatic pistol is recommended. You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition (remember on the indoor range ammunition must have a muzzle velocity of under 1200 feet per second), and eye and ear protection. Those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the course of fire. 22 caliber pistols are recommended because of the current cost of ammunition.

If you sign up at the mid-season break, the cost for the second half (10 weeks of shooting) would be \$15 for members and \$20 for non-members.

Junior Rifle Program

The Junior Rifle Program for shooters age 12 to 80 (or older) began on Saturday, October 30. The first four weeks of introduction have been consolidated into a 5- or 6-hour class where the students are introduced to rifle safety and shooting techniques including handling, maintenance, aiming, and shooting. They started shooting on Wednesday, November 3 and will shoot through the end of March. They usually shoot from 7:00 pm till 9:00 pm.

They have been off for the holidays and will resume shooting on Wednesday, January 5.

The cost for the practice session of the program is \$45 per shooter and includes the use of the rifle, all ammunition, and the loan of eye and ear protection.

The juniors are encouraged to bring their homework for times when they will be waiting to get on the range.

Open Trap Shooting

The Club holds open trap shoots on Wednesdays from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm and on Sundays from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm. The trap range is currently closed for the winter. The last Sunday shoot was December 26.

When the Sunday trap shoot resumes on March 6 (weather permitting) and the Wednesday shoot begins on April 3, they will be open to the public. Ammo is available at the trap range for \$10.00 a box of 25. League rounds are \$6.00 and that extra \$2.00 goes to supplies for the party and prize money.

Club Selling Its Garands and Carbines

The Club no longer offers the CMP shoot on Sunday mornings. The program offered members the opportunity to shoot the Club's WWII Garands and Carbines in a competitive shoot. The course of fire required 50 rounds of ammunition. Because the Club had a large supply of ammunition which had been acquired from the CMP Program at a very reasonable cost, we used to charge just \$25 for the use of the rifle and the ammunition for the shoot. However, things have changed. We can no longer obtain ammunition from the CMP program and can not offer this reduced cost to shoot. Current ammunition costs (if you can find it) would drive the cost of the Sunday morning shoot to close to \$100. This is not something we want to get into.

The Club has nine (9) garands and two (2) carbines which are not being used and will most likely not be used again. Two (2) of the Garands are non-functional and will not shoot w/o a major rebuild - they are basically "wall hangers." Rather then just store them indefinitely, the Directors have decided to sell them to our members.

The sale will be executed via a raffle. Everyone interested in purchasing one of the rifles will have their name put in a "hat." Names will be drawn from the hat to offer the right to purchase one of the rifles. Each person whose name is drawn will then have the opportunity to select which of the rifles they would like to purchase. (The purchase price is being determined.) The potential purchaser can decide at that time not to purchase any of the rifles and the name of another buyer will be selected out of the hat. This process will continue until all of the rifles are sold. The plan is to present the process at the January meeting and have everyone interested let Steve Boehm know of their interest. Then the sale would take place at the February membership meeting. All potential purchasers would have to be in attendance. The club will make arrangements for an FFL to transfer the rifles if necessary; however, the transfer costs would be paid by the buyer.

Metro Police Revolver League (MPRL)

The MPRL team shoots on Thursday evenings at 6:00 pm and is currently shooting indoors. They are currently practicing on the indoor range for their coming indoor season which will begin the week of January 10 and run for 14 weeks.

The team competes against teams from other clubs in the area, with each team shooting at their home club; scores are submitted to, and tallied by, the league scorekeeper. The team invites anyone who is interested to come out and give it a try. You can not impact the team scoring as only the best 4 sets of scores are submitted for the competition, but you will be able to shoot as if you were a member of the team. You'll get a feel for the shooting regime and meet the team.

They shoot both .22 and center fire pistols. You can shoot either or both courses of fire.
