Proposed Revision to the Club By-Laws

The Board of Directors is proposing and recommending a change to the By-Laws of the Club. The revision would change the number of directors on the Board of Directors from 15 to 12. Article 5, Section 3 of the By-Laws currently says that the Board of Directors have 15 individuals as Directors with 1/3 of the Directors (5) be elected every 3 years. The Board of Directors is recommending that the number of directors be lowered to 12 with 1/3 of the Board (4) being elected every 3 years.

The Board has deliberated this for several months and has come to the conclusion that having 12 directors instead of 15 will help the board operate more efficiently with no detrimental effect on the operation of the Club. In accordance with Article 12 of the By-Laws, Amendments, a revision to the By-Laws must be read 3 times at the membership meetings before it can be voted on, this amendment was read for the first time at the October 4, 2022, membership meeting. It will be read at the November and December membership meetings and will be voted on at the December meeting. If approved, the changes will be implemented in the January 2023 Board of Directors election. The proposed revision to the Club By-Laws is presented below.

Article 5 - Board of Directors

Section 1 - Composition

The Board of Directors shall consist of 12 members, elected as provided in this Article from among the members of the Club who meet the eligibility requirements as outlined in Section 2 of this Article.

Alternates - The Board of Directors may have up to 3 alternate directors at any time. The number of alternates accepted shall be determined by a vote of the board. Eligibility for alternate director shall be as described in Article 5, Section 2, Eligibility for Board of Directors. Alternates may participate in all Board of Director meetings but shall have no voting rights as a Board Member.

Section 2 - Eligibility for Board of Directors

No member shall be eligible to serve on the Board of Directors unless they have been a member of the Club for at least one full year. This eligibility requirement may be waived upon request of the Nominating Committee, and upon approval of two-thirds of the membership present at the November or December meeting. Similarly, nominations made from the floor can ask that the eligibility requirement be waived upon request made by the mover of the nomination. The Membership Chair shall verify each nominee.

Section 3 - Board Transition to 12 Directors

Beginning with the elections at the Membership meeting of January 2023, 3 Directors shall be elected to 3 (three) year terms. In each subsequent year, 4 Directors shall be elected. All Directors whose term of office has not expired as of the January 2023 election shall continue to hold office pursuant to Section 5 of the Article.

Board of Directors Election in January

Five seats on the Board of Directors are up for election at the January membership meeting. The
Board is made up of 15 directors who each serve a three-year term with one-third of the Board (five directors) being elected every January.

There is a proposed revision to the by-laws on the number of Directors on the Board and how many would be up for election (see Page 1). The proposed revision will be voted on at the December membership meeting. If approved, it will decrease the number of directors to 12 (from 15) which will affect the number of directors up for election. We will clarify the election with specific details after

the December membership meeting. If you would like to run for election to the Board

Lottery Calendar Fundraiser

The new Lottery Calendars, which are good from January through April 2023, are ready for members to pick-up and sell. The Board is asking each member to purchase (and/or sell 3 tickets). If all members would do that, this would be the best fundraiser we've ever had. They are packaged in envelopes of 5 or 10 calendars. The cost of each calendar is \$10 and each calendar contains one 3-digit number. The winning number is determined by the 3-digit evening PA Lottery number. They are valid on January 1st and are good through April. The calendars can be picked up at the Club anytime there is an organized shoot or meeting, such as trap shooting on Sundays from 1 pm to 4 pm and on Wednesdays from 6 pm to 9 pm (weather permitting); the Monday Night Recreational Pistol Shoot from 7:30 pm to 9 pm; the Junior Rifle program on Wednesday evenings from 7 pm to 9 pm; the MPRL shoot on Thursday from 6 pm to about 9 pm, and at the membership meetings from 8 pm to 10 pm; or the directors meetings, from 7 pm to 9 pm.

They make great stocking stuffers and are good for those last minute Christmas gifts. All tickets must be turned in at the Club or verification of sale must be made by e-mail by December 31.

The Club sells these Lottery Calendars twice a year. Members are urged to sell as many as they can because this is THE major fundraiser for the Club and has helped keep our dues at minimal levels. These calendar sales help the club keep the yearly dues as low as possible and still manage to finance special projects and general upkeep.

Again the Board of Directors is asking EVERY Club member to sell/buy at least 3 calendars.

USC Rifle Team Using Indoor Range Again

The Upper St. Clair High School (USC) rifle team will once again be using our indoor range for practice and meets. As you may recall they lost the use of their range at USC High School; this is the eighth year we will be hosting them at the Club. Through the last seven shooting seasons, there have been no major complaints from the membership on the team using the range which is closed to the membership while they are here. They will be using the range between 3:00 pm and 6:00 pm 3 or 4 days a week this season. Their schedule is presented below and will be posted by the indoor range sign-in book. We ask you to adjust your range usage to the days and times they are not shooting; to those members who have to adjust their shooting schedule we trust you will understand.

As a reminder to new members and those that have forgotten, the Upper St. Clair School District does compensate us for the use of the range. The money that they provide has been used to update and maintain the new .22 indoor range.

2023 Dues Are Due Now!

Junior Rifle Program

The Junior Rifle Program for shooters age 12 to 80 (or older) began on Sunday, October 30 with the introductory session. There are two parts to the program - an introductory session and a practice session. The introductory session which met on Sunday, October 30 covered rifle safety and shooting techniques including handling, maintenance, target acquisition, and shooting. The cost of this session is \$30.

The second part of the program is the practice session. After the introductory session, shooters will meet to shoot the rifles and improve their shooting skills under the direction of experienced instructors. These practice sessions are held on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 pm till 9:00 pm., starting on November 2 and continuing through the end of March. Because this is a school night for the juniors, they are encouraged to bring their homework for times when they will be waiting to get into the range.

The cost for the practice session of the program is \$90 per shooter and includes use of the rifle, all ammunition, and the loan of eye and ear protection. This is a total of \$120 for the complete program.

Recreational Pistol League

The Recreational Pistol League has been shooting on Monday evenings since September 12 with approximately 13 shooters. The League is loosely organized into teams which compete against each other over the season for bragging rights. Their season runs from September to late March. Shooting for 20 weeks at 7:30 pm, they take a break for the Christmas - New Year holiday season and enjoy a "banquet" at the end of the season. When their season ends, they switch over to shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range.

The course of fire includes 5 segments. The first segment is two lines of slow fire (each line is 5 shots in 2

minutes); the second segment is two lines of timed-fire (each line is 5 shots in 20 seconds); the next phase is two lines of rapid fire (each line is 5 shots in 10 seconds). Segment 4 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots in 45 seconds; and segment 5 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots - one-handed - in 60 seconds. All shooting is done on the old indoor range.

Because of the time constraints, a semi-automatic pistol is recommended. You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition (remember on the indoor range ammunition must have a muzzle velocity of under 1200 feet per second), and eye and ear protection. Those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the course of fire. 22 caliber pistols are recommended because of the current cost of ammunition.

The cost for the 20-week season is \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. Shooters that can't commit to the entire 20-week season can pay on a per-night basis - at \$3 per night for members and \$4 per night for non-members. If you sign up at the mid-season break, the cost for the second half would be \$15 for members and \$20 for non-members.
