# **FOAC Presentation on Concealed Carry**

The Club is holding a FREE seminar (on Saturday, May 18 from 9 am to noon) to learn the facts and have your questions answered about Pennsylvania's concealed carry permit laws, and other valuable information regarding firearms safety and state gun laws. The event, which is open to members and nonmembers, will feature FOAC President Jim Stoker and our state representative, Andrew Kuzma. Article 1, Section 21 of the Pennsylvania Constitution clearly states that "the right of the citizens to bear arms in defense of themselves and the state shall not be questioned." This no-cost seminar offers the dual opportunity for firearm owners to expand their knowledge of existing gun laws and to get their questions answered about safety and responsibly

exercising your God-given right to keep and bear arms.

# Lottery Calendars

The Lottery Calendars for the July - October 2024 lottery fundraiser are available for pick-up. On March 28, Club Treasurer Roni Plappert and the Metro Pistol Revolver League Team assembled the lottery calendars into packets of 5 and 10. Roni had mixed up the calendars, regrouped them in random number order, and prepared them for assembling the packets. She placed each packet of tickets (5 or 10) with the envelopes (the large manila envelope and the white return envelope). By the time the members of the Pistol Team arrived at the range all they needed to do was record the ticket numbers on the envelopes, then record each envelope on the ticket log along with their respective calendar lottery numbers and insert the packets into the large envelope. Accurately recording all this information in 3 separate places while assembling the packets requires a great deal of time. The Pistol Team members who helped were Reno Baum, Joe Defazio. Jim Johnson, and Denny Nill. Thanks to everyone for helping get this important fund raiser prepared for the club members.

The directors again urge everyone to sell as many Lottery Calendars as you can because this is a major fundraiser for the club. We are striving to reach the point where we sell all of the tickets for each calendar lottery fundraiser.

Each lottery calendar has a 3-digit number which is good for the PA evening 3-digit number and is good for the months of July through October. You can pick them up at the Club at Membership meetings, Director's meetings, or when the Club is holding a scheduled activity like the Monday night pistol shoot or the trap shoots on Wednesdays evenings and Sunday afternoons. Stubs MUST be returned before July 1. Please note that winning calendar payments are not

retroactive. Prize eligibility begins on the date the stubs are turned in. To be valid for payment, tickets must be either turned in at the Club or the sale must be verified by e-mail (see below) or phone call (to the Club message line at 724-348-7941) by June 30. If you have sold tickets but can't return the stubs to the Club before the deadline, you can call and leave your name and a brief message that envelope number "X" was sold or that tickets "a, b, and c" were sold. You can also send an e-mail

to any of the Club Directors stating the envelope number and which tickets were sold. (All of the Director's e-mails are listed at the end of this newsletter.) Either message will trigger eligibility on the sold tickets.

# **Club Negotiating Payment for Mineral Rights**

The Club was approached by EQT with an offer of a one-time payment for future royalties on the gas being taken from under the property. The offer would be a lump sum for all future extraction as opposed to the standing agreement with EQT for monthly royalties. The offer came with an document that was several pages long describing the agreement. The Directors thought it was in our best interest to have the agreement reviewed by a lawyer and we are currently exploring our options on this. Nothing has been settled as to the lump-sum payment

from EQT.

The work party scheduled for Saturday, May 18, has been canceled because the Club is hosting the FOAC and State Representative Andrew Kuzma for their 2nd Amendment Seminar (see Page 1).

## **Junior Rifle Program**

The Junior Rifle Program has completed its season. All the rifles have been cleaned and are stored until October when they will start another junior program.

The Junior Rifle Program is for shooters age 12 to 80 (or older). There are two parts to the Junior Rifle program - an introductory, one-day session which should be held in early October - where participants learn rifle safety and shooting techniques including handling, maintenance, aiming, and shooting. The cost for this portion of the program is tentatively \$50 per shooter and includes use of the rifle, eye and ear protection, and all ammunition. The cost may be adjusted if ammunition prices continue to escalate.

Following the introductory session is the practice portion of the program which runs to the end of March where the participants practice and develop the skills they acquired in the introductory session. They shoot every Wednesday from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The cost of the practice session is tentatively \$50 per shooter and, like the introductory session, includes use of the rifle, eye and ear protection, and all ammunition. The cost may be adjusted if ammunition prices continue to escalate.

Note - shooters have to complete the introductory session to participate in the practice session.

# **Junior Shotgun Program**

The Jr. Trap program will begin on Wednesday, June 5 at 6:00 p.m. They will shoot each Wednesday in June. This program is open to the public for anyone age 12 and up that would like to learn to shoot trap in a controlled, safe environment with experienced instructors. The cost is \$5 per line of 25 birds. The Club will provide the use of a shotgun and the necessary eye and ear protection, but the shooters will have to provide their own ammunition (shot no larger than 7-1/2). ### **Basic Pistol Class**

The Club is trying to schedule another beginner firearms class for women and men. The class will be designed for beginners and those who need a refresher in basic firearms skills. As soon as the class can be structured and properly staffed we will advertise it to the club members and the public.

The Club understands that firearms can be frightening and intimidating for some people, so the class will cover safety awareness, proper handling techniques, how handguns work, and self protection.

The fee for the class should be about \$35 for members and \$50 for non-members

# **Open Trap Shooting**

The Club holds open trap shooting on Wednesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and on Sundays from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. These shoots are open to the public. The Sunday shoots started in March and have been able to shoot most Sundays thanks to the reasonably good weather. The Wednesday shoots started in April. Shooters may bring their own ammunition, but shot size may be no larger than 7-1/2. (A larger number denotes a smaller shot size.)

The cost for a 25-bird line of trap is now \$4.00. Shooters can bring their own shotgun shells (shot no larger than 7 1/2) or they can buy shotgun shells at \$8.00 a box at the range.

# **Recreational Pistol League**

The Monday Night Pistol League has finished its season and is now shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range. The number of shooters has leveled off at about 8 - 10 each Monday.

The cost to shoot the silhouettes is \$2 per line with the winner of the line getting his money back. You will need your favorite .22 firearm, 30 rounds of ammunition per line (with a velocity no greater than 1200 fps), and eye and ear protection.

There is normally no need to sign up for this Monday Night Silhouette Shoot; just come to the Club about 7:15 p.m. and check in.

The silhouettes are metal targets that resemble rabbits, groundhogs, and pigs. Each round is timed and consists of 10 shots at each target. There are a total of 30 shots per round.

# **Range Rules Reminder**

With the coming of the new year, it is a good time to remind all club members that they MUST adhere to the range rules when shooting at the club facilities.

This includes using ECI's (empty chamber indicators), and loading no more than 5 rounds at a time on the indoor and outdoor ranges. This is a safety issue and is also part of the Club's federal consent agreement with South Park Township.

A few other rules that the club imposes are: firearms are to be pointed down range at all times and no handling of any firearm when someone is down range. Also, remember to turn off the lights and close the doors on the ranges when you leave. It is the responsibility of every club member to make sure everything is secure and cleaned up before leaving the grounds. All of the ranges and shooting positions are on camera and video tape. Everything you do on a range can be reviewed. If the Directors discover that you are not in compliance with the range rules, you will be notified of the violations once and, if the behavior continues, you risk losing your Rangemaster status and possible termination of your membership.
