Carry Permit Event

The Allegheny County Sheriff's Office is holding a License to Carry Event at the South Park Township Community Center on Saturday, August 17, 2024 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. This event is for new and renewal applicants with Allegheny County residency. The Community Center is located at 3675 Brownsville Road (just minutes from the Club). The event will be on a first-come, first-served basis as appointments are not available.

In addition, Project D.U.M.P. will be on-site to accept unused and expired medications.

Applicants need to bring with them their completed application, a valid PA ID or driver's license, and \$20 cash. The application can be downloaded at https://sheriffalleghenycounty.com/firearms.

A person must be 21 years of age or older to apply for a License to Carry Firearms. The license allows individuals to carry a loaded firearm concealed on their body or in a vehicle and is valid for five years unless revoked. The process includes a criminal background check through the Pennsylvania Instant Check System (PICS). (Under 18 Pa. C.S. §6109, a sheriff may deny a License to Carry Firearms if they believe a person's character and reputation is such that they would likely act in a manner dangerous to public safety.)

Some reasons to get a concealed carry permit include:

- **Protection**: Having a permit allows you to carry a firearm enabling you to respond quickly to a situation wherever you are.
- **Right**: The Second Amendment of the Constitution gives citizens the right to defend themselves and their property.
- Crime: Firearm owners can use their guns to deter crime.
- Avoiding potential violations: A permit allows you to carry a loaded firearm. If you are stopped for any reason in going from the club to your home, and the police determine you have a firearm in the same case as your ammunition, you would be in violation of the law which requires that the firearm and ammunition cannot be in the same section of the car. A permit allows you to have the firearm, loaded or not, in the vehicle.

In Pennsylvania, you must be at least 21 years old and have a valid LCF to carry a concealed weapon. Carrying a firearm without a license is a felony if it's concealed on your body or in a vehicle, except in your home or business. If you're eligible to possess a license but commit no other criminal violation, it's a first-degree misdemeanor. If you're ineligible for a license, the charges are even higher.

Mentored Hunting Program Changed

Continuing its efforts to get more people involved in hunting in the Commonwealth, the Pennsylvania Board of Game Commissioners recently approved a plan to allow mentors hunting with a mentored youth to accompany up to two additional hunters, be they mentored youth, junior hunters, or mentored adults.

Previously, no additional junior or mentored hunters could accompany a mentor hunting with a mentored youth. There was a required one-to-one mentor/mentee ratio. That limit has now changed to three.

The requirement that limits mentors and mentored youth to possessing only one sporting arm between them remains. The mentor must carry the sporting arm at all times while moving. Junior hunters and mentored adults may possess their own sporting arms while accompanied by a common mentor. This change will be in place in time for the fall hunting seasons.

Monday Night Recreational Pistol League

Bowling Pin Shoot

The Monday Night Recreational Pistol League is shooting bowling pins on the first Monday of the month on the 25-yard outdoor range.

The course of fire is 5 relays per line with 5 shots per relay for a total of 25 rounds per line. There are two shooters on the line at a time, The goal is to shoot the suspended bowling pins and make them swing on the target holder. This is a shoot for center fire pistols.

To participate in the shoot, just show up at 6:00 pm; the shoot will start no later then 6:30 pm. The cost is \$2 per line; half of the fee goes to the club and half goes to the top shooter for that line.

In the event of rain the group will move to the indoor range and shoot metal silhouettes,

Recreational Pistol League Started on September 9

The Recreational Pistol League will be starting their regular 20-week season on Monday, September 9 at 7:00 p.m. on the indoor range. They shoot for 10 weeks and then take a break at the Christmas - New Year holiday. They resume in early January for another 10-week period and enjoy a "banquet" at the end of the season. After their 20-week season ends (some time in March) the league will swing over to shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range, and perhaps a few nights of shooting bowling pins on the outdoor range.

The league is loosely organized into teams which compete against each other over the season for bragging rights.

The course of fire includes 5 segments - all on regulation NRA targets. The first segment is two lines of slow fire (each at 5 shots in 2 minutes); the second segment is two lines of timed-fire (each at 5 shots in 20 seconds); the next phase is two lines of rapid fire (each at 5 shots in 10 seconds). Segment 4 is 5 shots, change magazine, 5 more shots, all in 45 seconds; and segment 5 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots all in 60 seconds - one-handed. You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition (remember - on the indoor range, ammu-

nition must have a muzzle velocity of under 1200 feet per second), and eye and ear protection. Because of the time considerations and the cost of ammunition, a .22 caliber semi-automatic pistol is recommended. However, those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the course of fire.

The cost for the 20-week season is \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. Shooters that can't commit to the entire 20-week season can pay on a per-night basis; \$3 per night for members and \$4 per night for non-members.

Junior Rifle Program

The Junior Rifle Program will begin in October.

The Junior Rifle Program is for shooters age 12 to 80 (or older). There are two parts to the Junior Rifle program - an introductory, one-day session which should be held in early October - where participants learn rifle safety and shooting techniques including handling, maintenance, aiming, and shooting. The cost for this portion of the program is tentatively \$50 per shooter and includes use of the rifle, eye and ear protection, and all ammunition. The cost may be adjusted if ammunition prices continue to escalate.

Following the introductory session is the practice portion of the program which runs to the end of March where the participants practice and develop the skills they acquired in the introductory session. They shoot every Wednesday from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The cost of the practice session is tentatively \$50 per shooter and, like the introductory session, includes use of the rifle, eye and ear protection, and all ammunition. The cost may be adjusted if ammunition prices continue to escalate.

Note - shooters have to complete the introductory session to participate in the practice session.

Junior Shotgun Program

The Jr. Trap program shot trap on Wednesdays through the month of June. The program was open to the public for anyone age 12 and up that would like to learn to shoot trap in a controlled, safe environment with experienced instructors. The cost was \$5 per line of 25 birds. The Club provided the use of a shotgun and the necessary eye and ear protection, but the shooters provided their own ammunition (shot no larger than 7-1/2).

Club Rifle Team

The Club's Rifle Team which is part of the Pittsburgh and Suburban Rifle League will be starting their practice sessions soon. The league shoots 3-position small-bore rifle. All matches this season will be postal, i.e., each team shoots at their home range and the scores are tallied by a league scorekeeper. Adults and juniors shoot together on the team with the top 5 scores for the night counting as the team score. Currently, they will be shooting on Sunday evenings starting at 5:00 p.m. They use .22LR boltaction rifles with non-magnifying scopes or open sights. If you don't have a bolt-action rifle you can use one of the club's. The course of fire consists of 30 shots, 10 shots prone, 10 shots standing, and 10 shots kneeling, with no time limit. The top 5 scores count toward the match each week.

This year there will be at least 8 teams participating from as far away as Akron and Erie. Practices will begin in September and matches will start on October 9 and run through April. Their schedule is included on Page 7. At the end of the year they will have a banquet with an awards presentation.

Range Rules Reminder

With the coming of the new year, it is a good time to remind all club members that they MUST adhere to the range rules when shooting at the club facilities.

This includes using ECI's (empty chamber indicators), and loading no more than 5 rounds at a time on the indoor and outdoor ranges. This is a safety issue and is also part of the Club's federal consent agreement with South Park Township.

A few other rules that the club imposes are: firearms are to be pointed down range at all times and no handling of any firearm when someone is down range. Also, remember to turn off the lights and close the doors on the ranges when you leave. It is the responsibility of every club member to make sure everything is secure and cleaned up before leaving the grounds. All of the ranges and shooting positions are on camera and video tape. Everything you do on a range can be reviewed. If the Directors discover that you are not in compliance with the range rules, you will be notified of the violations once and, if the behavior continues, you risk losing your Rangemaster status and possible termination of your membership.


