Range Rules Reminder

The beginning of a new year is a good time to remind all club members that they MUST adhere to the range rules when shooting at the club facilities. This includes using ECI's (empty chamber indicators), and loading no more than 5 rounds at any time on the indoor and outdoor ranges. This is a safety issue and is also part of the Club's federal consent agreement with South Park Township.

A few other rules that the club imposes are: firearms are to be pointed down range at all times and there is to be **no handling of any firearm** when someone is down range. Also, remember to turn off the lights and close the doors/gates on the ranges when you leave. It is the responsibility of every club member to make sure everything is secure and cleaned up before leaving the grounds. All of the ranges and shooting positions are on camera and video tape. **Everything you do on a range is on tape.** If the Directors discover that you are not in compliance with the range rules, you will be notified of the violations once and, if the behavior continues, you risk losing your Rangemaster status and possibly your club membership.

For the explanation of the payment, please include only your membership number. If you add additional information, Venmo thinks the club is selling you something and will sometimes charge a service fee.

Pittsburgh and Suburban Rife League (PSRL)

The CSC PSRL team shoots on Sunday evenings on the indoor range starting about 5:00 p.m. They are cur-

rently off for the holidays and will resume shooting on January 5 and continue through early March. They are looking for new members to shoot on the team.

The league shoots 3-position small-bore rifle. All matches are postal, i.e., each team shoots at their home range and the scores are tallied by a league scorekeeper. Adults and juniors shoot together on the same team with the top 5 scores for the night counting as the team score. Currently, they are shooting on Sunday evenings starting at 5:00 pm They use .22LR bolt-action rifles with non-magnifying scopes (red-dots) or open sights. If you don't have a bolt-action rifle you can use one of the club's. The course of fire consists of 30 shots, 10 shots prone, 10 shots standing, and 10 shots kneeling, with no time limit. The top 5 scores are used as the team's score for the match each week.

There are 7 teams participating from as far away as Akron and Erie. The matches generally run through March with a couple of weeks break in December. At the end of the year they have a banquet with an awards presentation. Reminder Club Calendar on Our Website

Recreational Pistol League

The Recreational Pistol League has been shooting on Monday evenings since September 9 with approximately 18 shooters. They finished the first half of their season in December and were shooting steel silhouettes during their holiday brake.

The second half of their season will begin on January 6; they will shoot another 10 weeks until mid-March and enjoy a "banquet" at the end of the season. When their season ends, they will switch over to shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range and perhaps start up the bowling pin shoot again.

Their normal course of fire includes 5 segments. The first segment is two lines of slow fire (each line is 5 shots in 2 minutes); the second segment is two lines of timed-fire (each line is 5 shots in 20 seconds); the next phase is two lines of rapid fire (each line is 5 shots in 10 seconds). Segment 4 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots in 45 seconds; and segment 5 is 5 shots, change magazines, 5 more shots - **one-handed** - in 60 seconds. All shooting is done on the old indoor range.

Because of the time constraints, a semi-automatic pistol is recommended. You will need your favorite firearm, 50 rounds of ammunition (remember on the indoor range ammunition must have a muzzle velocity not greater than 1200 feet per second), and eye and ear protection. Those with revolvers and speed loaders should have enough time to complete the course of fire. 22 caliber pistols are recommended because of the current cost of ammunition.

The cost for the entire 20-week season is \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. Shooters that can't commit to the entire 20-week season can pay on a per-night basis - at \$3 per night for members and \$4 per night for non-members. If you sign up at the mid-season break, the cost for the second half is \$15 for members and \$20 for non-members.
