

First Steps Pistol Course

When 2 or 3 individuals have expressed an interest, a course time and date will be set. The cost of the course is \$20 per participant. Participants need not be members of the Club. If you don't have a firearm, the Club will provide a .22 caliber firearm and 50 rounds of ammunition for an additional \$5.

Participants will provide their own firearm and ammunition. A minimum of 98 rounds of ammunition will be required but participants are urged to bring extra ammunition. Firearms of .38 (revolver) or 9mm (semiauto) caliber or larger are recommended but smaller calibers are permitted.

Basic/Advanced Personal Protection Outside the Home

This 14-hour course is scheduled for Saturday, September 3 and Saturday, September 10 from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm each day.

Participants must be experienced shooters: they must be able to show the mastery of the basic skills of safe gun handling, drawing and re-holstering a firearm, shooting groups, zeroing the firearm, and cleaning the firearm. They must also have taken the Personal Protection in the Home Course, or equivalent, or pass a pre-course assessment test. There will be a \$10 fee for the preassessment test, Pass or Fail.

The cost is \$150 for non-Club member or \$120 for Club members.

To take the course, the following items are required: Handgun

A handgun that is practical to carry concealed.

Holster or Holster Purse

No exclusively competition style holsters are permitted.

Speed Loaders/Magazines

Speed loaders and magazines are required along with speed loader or magazine pouches (pouches are optional if carrying the speed loader or magazine in your pocket/ purse).

• Clothing

Concealed carry clothing such as a jacket, sport coat, or vest is required.

Miscellaneous

Knee pads (if you need them).

Eye and ear protection.
