

Basic Pistol Course

The Club will be conducting an NRA Basic Pistol Shooting Course on Saturday, March 24 from 8:30 am till 4:30 pm.

The course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude for safely owning and operating a handgun.

The course is a minimum of 8 hours and includes classroom and range time learning to shoot revolvers and/or semi-automatic pistols. Students learn NRA's rules for safe gun handling; pistol parts and operation; ammunition; shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting from the bench rest position, and two handed standing positions; cleaning the pistol; and continued opportunities for skill development. They will receive the NRA Guide to the Basics of Pistol Shooting handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, take a Basics of Pistol Shooting Student Examination, and receive a course completion certificate.

The course fee is \$60 for Club members and \$75 for non-members. A \$25 non-refundable deposit is required. Bring a lunch and non-alcoholic beverage.

If you bring your own firearm, the following ammunition restrictions apply; velocity must be less than 1200 fps, no +P, +P+, Magnum, or .17 or 5.7x28 cartridges permitted.

If you do not have your own firearm the Club will provide .22 caliber firearms and ammunition for you to you use along with eye and ear protection.

Prerequisites to the Personal Protection Courses

The Basic Pistol Course is a prerequisite to the Personal Protection in the Home (PPITH) Course. The PPITH Course is then the prerequisite to the Personal Protection Outside the Home (PPOTH) Course. Participants in the PPITH Course must be experienced shooters, exhibiting the mastery of the basic skills of safe gun handling, shooting groups, zeroing and cleaning firearms. We have many members who fit these criteria but have not taken the Basic Pistol Course but have an interest in taking the PPITH Course. There are "proofs of shooting experience" that can qualify as a prerequisite for the PPITH Course. In addition to the Basic Pistol Course certificate, NRA First Steps Course certificate, NRA pistol competitive shooting qualification card, military DD214 with pistol qualification or passing a Pre-Course Assessment can satisfy the proof of shooting experience.
