

New Monday Night Shoot

The Club is offering a new Monday Night Pistol Shoot. Shooters can now shoot bowling pins on the 50-yard outdoor range. Shooters interested in trying this style of shooting are encouraged to come up on Monday evening and try it. They shoot at 6:00 p.m.

Shooters have 2 minutes for 5 shots at the 5 suspended pins which are set at 25 yards. The course of fire includes 5 lines of 5 shots each for a total of 25 rounds. The cost is \$2.00 per line with the winner (the shooter with the most hits) gets 50% of the pot. To be eligible to win the pot you have to shoot iron sights. Red dots are permitted but then you are not elegible for the prize. Pistols can be up to 45 calibre; 22's are OK but don't have much impact on the pins, and no 454's or 50 cal. If there is more interest in this shoot the club will build a few more target holders and acquire a few more pins so more shooters can participate in a timely manner.

Metro Police Revolver League

The Metropolitan Police Revolver League shoots on Thursday evenings on the outdoor range. Their outdoor season began in mid-May and will continue through August.

The team is always looking for good pistol shooters: .22 and or centerfire. The team invites anyone who is interested to come out to one of their Thursday night shoots and give it a try. Their competition can be described as trying to shoot the bottom of a spray painted one-pound coffee can 50 yards downrange with your favorite pistol in one hand, standing up with no rest.

Bull's-eye goes back to the 1941 and is the granddaddy of all popular handgun competition in this country. Its has been the standard for national and state championships, regional championships, and most outdoor tournaments.

If this sounds interesting and challenging, come out and give it a try. The team shoots on Thursday evenings at 6:00 p.m.

All you need is a .22 caliber or center fire pistol that can hold at least 5 rounds with a barrel length that is practical for target shooting; the gun should have adjustable sights if you are going to use iron sights but red dot sights (not lasers) are also permitted; at least 30 rounds of ammunition for each gun; and eye and ear protection (mandatory). A spotting scope is also very helpful; however, it is not really needed to participate.

You can shoot both .22 and center fire or just either.

The team usually starts with the .22 match. The first target is a slow fire target and you have 10 minutes to shoot 10 rounds. The second target is a timed fire target and you shoot two five-shot strings, each string to be fired in a time of 20 seconds. The third target is a rapid fire target and you shoot two five-shot strings, each string fired in a time of 10 seconds. After the .22 match they do it all over again but with a center fire firearm.

Both revolvers and semi-autos are permitted, however, a semi-auto is easier for the timed and rapid fire stages.

For indoor competition, all targets are posted at 50 feet; for outdoor competition the slow fire target is posted at 50 yards and the timed and rapid fire targets at 25 yards.

They will be more than glad to introduce you to the sport and tell you all about it. You are welcome to join the team in the live firing of each stage so you can get a feel for what they do. If you have any questions, call Deny Nill at 412-531-5890 or Bill Kramer at 412-835-5453.
