Bowling Pin Shoot

The Bowling Pin Shoot is underway on the outdoor range every Monday at 6:00 pm using suspended bowling pins as targets. The cost is \$2 per line and the winner of each line gets 1/2 of the money paid to shoot. You need a center fire pistol with iron sights to compete for the prize money. You can use a red dot sight but you are not eligible to win the money. The course of fire is 25 rounds per line. You will need a center-fire pistol, 25 rounds per line, and eye and ear protection. Each 5-shot round of shooting is timed at 1 minute.

There is no need to pre-register for the Monday Night Bowling Pin Shoot; just come to the Club about 5:45 pm and check in.

They will continue to shoot bowling pins until the end of August.

Range Rules

NRA Courses at the Club

Basic Pistol Course

The Club offered its last Basic Pistol course this year on June 28. Another one may be offered in the Fall if there is enough interest.

The course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude for safely owning and operating a handgun.

The course is a minimum of 8 hours and includes classroom and range time learning to shoot revolvers and/or semi-automatic pistols. Students learn NRA's rules for safe gun handling; pistol parts and operation; ammunition; shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting from the bench rest position, and two handed standing positions; cleaning the pistol; and continued opportunities for skill development.

PPIH and PPOH Courses

The Club is offering the Personal Protection In the Home

(PPIH) course on Saturday, October 11 and the Personal Protection Outside the Home (PPOH) on Saturday, November 1 and Saturday, November 8 (this is a 2-day class). The cost of the PPIH class is \$60 for Club members and \$75 for non-members; the cost for the PPOH course is \$120 for Club members and \$150 for non-members. Shooters must be 21 years old to take these courses. There are prerequisites for each of these courses.

Tactical Shoot

A Tactical shoot has been developed for those who have successfully completed either the PPIH or PPOH courses. The course provides those that passed the courses an opportunity to practice what they learned in the Personal Protection courses. They are held every other month, alternating between Tuesday evenings and Saturday mornings. Contact Denny Nill for details on this shoot.

Metro Police Revolver League

The Metropolitan Police Revolver League is shooting on Thursday evenings on the outdoor range and will continue their outdoor season through August. They are currently in 4th place in .22 competition (out of 5 teams) and 4th place in center-fire (out of 4 teams).

The team is always looking for good pistol shooters - .22 and/ or center fire. The team invites anyone who is interested to come out to one of their Thursday night shoots and give it a try. They will explain the shoot and you can actually shoot with them. Your score can not hurt the team. So if you'd like to try it, just show up and shoot with the team.

They shoot their competition in a standing, one-hand (no rest) position at 50 yards. The target is about the size of the bottom of a one-pound coffee can.

This form of competition (often called Bull's-eye) goes back to 1904 and is the granddaddy of all popular handgun competitions in this country. It has been the standard for national and state championships, regional championships, and most outdoor tournaments.

You can shoot .22 and/or center fire and all you need is your favorite .22 caliber or center fire pistol that can hold at least 5 rounds with a barrel length that is practical for target shooting; the gun should have adjustable sights if you are going to use iron sights but red dot sights (not lasers) are also permitted; at least 30 rounds of ammunition for each gun; and eye and ear protection (mandatory). A spotting scope is also very helpful; however, it is not really necessary to participate.

The team usually starts with the .22 match. The first target is a slow-fire target with 10 minutes to shoot 10 rounds. The second target is a timed-fire target and you shoot two five-shot strings, each string fired in 20 seconds. The third target is a rapid-fire target and you shoot two five-shot strings, each string fired in 10 seconds.

After the .22 match they do it all over again but with a center fire pistol.

Both revolvers and semi-automatics are permitted, however, a semi-auto is easier for the timed and rapid fire stages.

For indoor competition, all targets are posted at 50 feet; for

outdoor competition the slow fire target is posted at 50 yards and the timed and rapid fire targets are at 25 yards.

They will be more than glad to introduce you to the sport and tell you all about it. You are welcome to join the team on Thursday evening so you can get a feel for their competition. If you have any questions, call Denny Nill at 412-531-5890 or Bill Kramer at 412-835-5453.

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Hi-Power Shoot is held on the 2nd Sunday of the month at 10:00 am on the 100-yard outdoor range.
